Ms. Stanford,

Pursuant to rule 8.5(c) of the Mississippi Rules of Criminal Procedure, no later than seven (7) days after the commencement of the Circuit Court term, the sheriff is responsible for providing you, the district attorney, and the presiding Circuit Court judge a list of the individuals in jail on felony charges. Because this list is supposed to be compiled according to the rules of criminal procedure, and it appears that the list has not been compiled, I respectfully request that you contact the Sheriff's Office and retrieve the information. You may also forward my Public Records Request to the County Attorney for Union County to assist you in this matter.

Please note the penalties for failing to comply with a Public Records Request pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. 25-61-1 *et seq.* Feel free to reach out to me should you have any questions. I fully intend to cooperate with you all regarding this request, and I am willing to agree to a reasonable extension to allow you all the time to compile the list. However, should the request fail to be complied with, I will proceed appropriately to compel compliance.
